

**Board of Health Meeting  
October 14, 2009**

The Lakeville Board of Health held a meeting on October 14, 2009 in the Lakeville Town Office Building. Members present were William E. Garvey, Terrence Flynn and Pietro Panettieri. Also present were Health Agent Lawrence Perry and Board of Health Supervisor Nancy Teser, as recording secretary.

Chairman Garvey called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m.

**Jerry Velozo/Twin Boys, LLC      Goat Island      (049-001-001)**

First on the agenda was an appointment with **Jerry Velozo/Twin Boys, LLC**, requesting permission to possibly construct some kind of habitation on **Goat Island (Ram Island per Intrepid) (049-001-001)**. Velozo said he would like to construct some kind of habitation there because of all the littering and vandalism that has been happening there. Board members noted they had no problem with him having a camp, but they could not grant him permission to stay there overnight because there wasn't any running water or septic system on the island. Chairman Garvey said they would sign off on the "Building Department Form", but the "sign-off" would be no overnight stay. No other action was taken at this time.

**(3) Proposals to provide public health nursing services**

Board members received and reviewed three proposals to provide public health nursing services for communicable disease investigation and reporting; whereas the Visiting Nurse Association of Southeastern Massachusetts, Inc. was terminating services effective November 15, 2009. The proposals were from the **Town of Middleborough Health Department**, the **South Shore Hospital, d/b/a South Shore Visiting Nurse Association**, and the **Brockton Visiting Nurse Association**. Upon motion made by Member Flynn and seconded by Member Panettieri the Board

VOTED: To **approve the proposal from the Town of Middleborough Health Department**. Board members told Supervisor Teser to forward the three proposals to Town Administrator Rita A. Garbitt, whereas she is the Procurement Officer, but inform her that they approved the proposal from the Town of Middleborough Health Department. Unanimous vote.

**Meeting Minutes**

VOTED: To approve a (4) four-bedroom septic design plan, subject to receiving a revised application, variance letter and revised plans with all of the right calculations on them. Unanimous vote.

(Not on Agenda) Health Agent Perry brought up some discussion relative to a Title V inspection done on October 1, 2009 at 4 Hiltz Avenue requiring “further evaluation”. Board members agreed with Perry that it could be a “conditional pass”; whereas one existing pit appeared to be functioning optimally at the time, and it has taken all the flow over the past two weeks. After further discussion, Board members stated that the deteriorated distribution box would need to be replaced; the deteriorated concrete outlet tee would need to be replaced, and the backwash needed to be rerouted, if not already done. Board members also noted that the “failing” pit might possibly rejuvenate with Department of Environmental Protection approved additives should the owner decide to do so. Health Agent Perry was told to contact the Title V inspector or the homeowner. No other action was taken at this time.

Discussion was held regarding a letter drafted to the Superintendent of Schools and then it would be sent to the parents of school children about receiving or not receiving the HINI vaccine at the school. Chairman Garvey told Supervisor Teser to contact Fire Chief Hopkins on this matter and get a copy of the letter drafted by Deputy Fire Chief Goodfellow for his review. Upon motion made by Flynn and seconded by Member Panettieri the Board

VOTED: To send this letter to the Superintendent of Schools after Chairman Garvey’s review.

Vendor warrants were signed by the Board.
