



Discussion in regard to Arsenic contamination in ground water – Board Members reviewed the draft copy of Agent Perry’s Arsenic Public Health Advisory. All agreed that it was rather lengthy and should be condensed. Member Flynn stated that we only require residents test their water when they are selling their property and their well is within 100 feet of their septic. He suggested that maybe the Board should require them to test their water each time a Title V Inspection is done. Member Poillucci said that a lot of banks do require that. Board Members were concerned that a lot of people very rarely ever test their water, and this may be a good thing. There was discussion of looking into some type of grant that would possibly help residents with the cost of testing their water. Board Members felt that any properties that have a Title V Inspection for whatever reason should have to submit a water test with the report. Board Members agreed to continue this discussion until more information is gathered.

Discussion in regard to “Residential Swimming & Wading Pool Regulations” – Health Agent Perry recommended to the Board that the references to the Building Dept. on BOH pool regulations should be removed and simplified to include only the BOH requirements.

Upon motion made by Member Flynn and seconded by Member Poillucci, the Board:

**VOTED:** To remove any references to Building Dept. on the BOH Pool regulations. Unanimous vote in favor.

**Acceptance of Meeting Minutes**

Board Members reviewed the minutes from the meeting held on June 12, 2013.

Upon motion made by Member Poillucci and seconded by Member Flynn, the Board:

**VOTED:** To accept the Board of Health Minutes for June 12, 2013 as typed. Unanimous vote in favor.

Board Members reviewed the Norfolk-Ram / Island Terrace Nursing Home (071-001-002) Soil Evaluation and Perc test Information Report

Board Members reviewed the Notice of intention to access 4 Cherry St. (42-20-18) for water sample collection from private water supply well conducted on July 5, 2013.

Member Poillucci stated that he felt the Board should vote now that once the state alerts us that our area is at “high” risk for EEE we should automatically put the curfew on and notify the appropriate departments. (i.e.: Schools, Parks etc.). Member Flynn wanted to confirm that the information for the Plymouth County Mosquito Control for property spraying is still on the Town’s website.

Upon motion made by Member Poillucci and seconded by Member Flynn, the Board:

**VOTED:** To automatically put the EEE curfew on when alerted by the state that the Town is at “high” risk and notify the appropriate departments. Unanimous vote in favor.

Health Agent Perry brought to the Board's attention that a Farmer's Market was going to be held soon and needs a Temporary Food Establishment Permit. He stated that it took some time for the applicant to get all the necessary paperwork together and asked the Board if they would vote to allow him to sign off on these types of permits.

Upon motion made by Member Flynn and seconded by Member Poillucci, the Board:

**VOTED:** To authorize Health Agent Perry to approve Temporary Food Establishment Permits. Unanimous vote in favor.

Upon motion made by Member Flynn and seconded by Member Poillucci, the Board:

**VOTED:** To adjourn the meeting at 6:25 p.m. Unanimous vote in favor.
